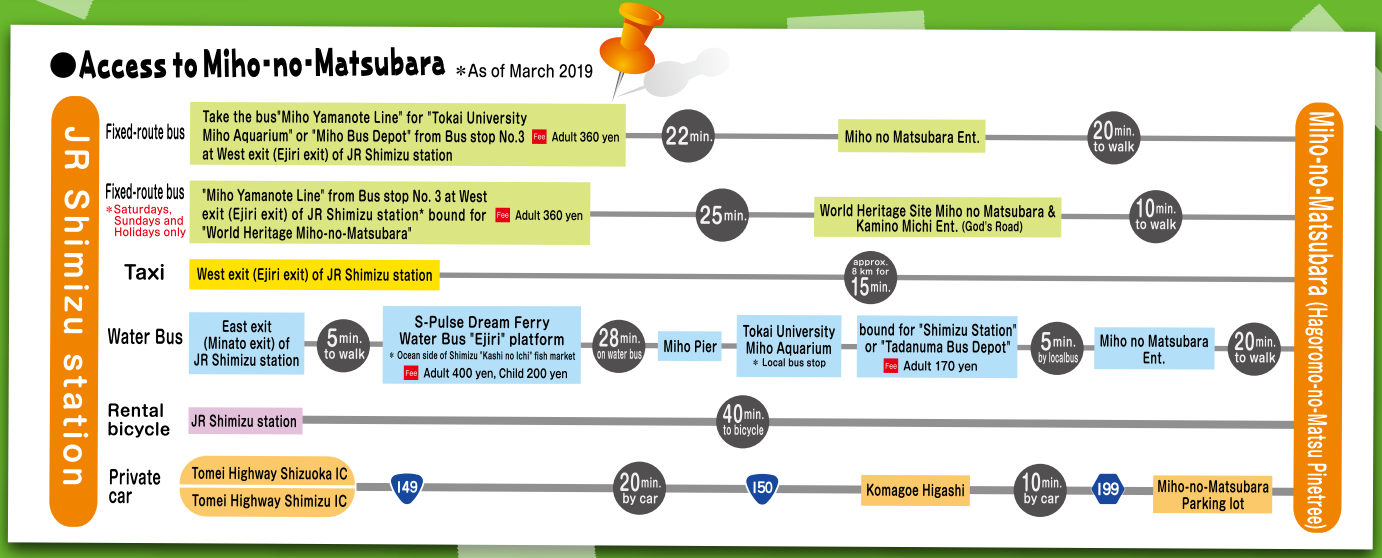

18 Tomato Farm (Harvested all year around)

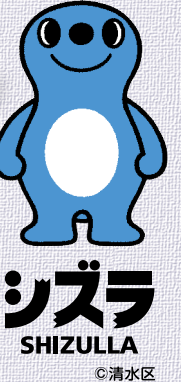

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Historical & Cultural spots

Miho-no-Matsubara
A scenic spot of White Sand and Blue ocean, where more than 30,000 pine trees lined with coastlines of about 7 km. Registered as a part of Mt.Fuji's world heritage site in June 2013 as "Fujisan, sacred place and source of artistic inspiration." The spectacular views will surely satisfy you.



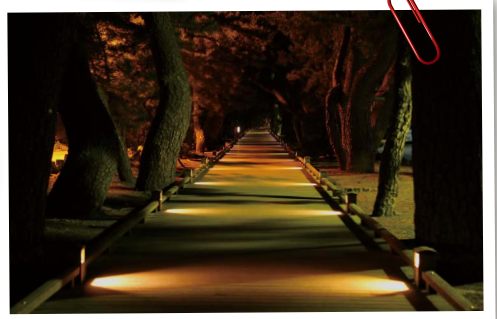

Hagoromo-no-Matsu Pinetree
It is known for the Hagoromo Legend, saying a celestial floated down and left her feathered robe, Hagoromo, on the pine tree. Current tree is the third generation. It is thought to be 200 years old, and there was an alternation of generations in 2010.

Kami-no-Michi (God's Road)
The approach to Miho Shrine from Miho-no-Matsubara, lined with pine trees, which are thought to be 200 years old, for about 500m. It is illuminated at night and its fantastic atmosphere is perfect for lovers to go out with, helping them to get closer.

Miho Shrine
Old shrine even recorded in some books from the Heian period. A sacred horse is enshrined in the precincts. It is a popular power spot for conjugal harmony and matchmaking.

Monument inscribed with poems for literature walk
Many literatians including Kitahara Hakushu and Yosano Akiko leave the beauty of pine trees and Mt. Fuji into the poems. Why donot you enjoy the world of poems while walking through the promenade?

Monument for New Three Views of Japan
It was selected as one of the New Three scenery of Japan with Onuma Quasi-National Park in Hokkaido and Yabakei in Oita.

Monument to Elene
A French dancer, Elene Giuglaris longed to see Miho-no-Matsubara, but died before she could visit the place. A fewstrands of her hair are buried under the monument and the Takigi Noh presented to her spirit is held annually in October.



Newly open Shizuoka City Miho-no-Matsubara

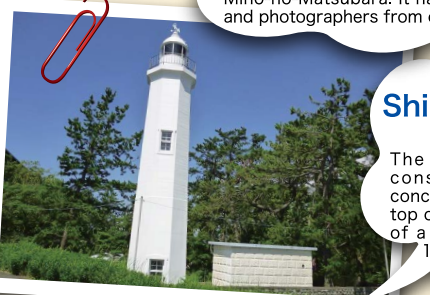

Shimizu Lighthouse (Miho Lighthouse)
The first lighthouse in Japan constructed with reinforced concrete. The weathervane at the top of the lighthouse has a shape of a celestial. It celebrated its 100th anniversary in 2012.

Miho Fureai Plaza
The former Japanese National Railway used to locate the Mihoterminal of Shimizu Port Line. Freight trains used at that time were exhibited, and the Tsunami evacuation tower was also constructed in 2013. It is perfect place to take a break with many benches.
